1 Resolution in Support of a Fully Funded Tuition Freeze and Funding the UW System

- 2 Whereas: College affordability and accessibility are critical in Wisconsin, allowing citizens to
- 3 receive higher educations and move the Wisconsin Idea forward;
- 4 Whereas: From 2011-2016, the cumulative cuts from to the UW System's budget has totaled
- 5 \$795 million, an amount that has more than begun to limit universities' ability to support
- 6 students as well as their ability to attract and retain high caliber faculty and staff 1;
- 7 Whereas: In 2023, the Wisconsin State Legislature cut another \$32 million dollars from the UW
- 8 System's biannual budget ²;
- 9 Whereas: As the rate of inflation continues to increase, it is becoming increasingly difficult for
- the UW System to provide for its students and have influenced increasing tuition rates;
- 11 Whereas: Adjusted for inflation and removing costs previously not help in the UW System
- budget, Wisconsin now spends a historically low amount on the service of educating UW System
- 13 students;
- Whereas: The effects of the UW System budget cuts include reduced class offerings, limited
- support programs, increase class sizes, and reduced professor and student contact time, all
- resulting in increased time to earn a degree;
- Whereas: The ending of the tuition freeze saw an immediate rise in tuition rates across the UW
- 18 System with an average 4.9% increase of overall tuition across the system ³;
- 19 Whereas: A tuition freeze would stop the large increases in tuition seen at the beginning of this
- 20 academic year and will continue to happen for years to come;

- Whereas: If a tuition freeze was introduced, a substantial state funding increase over the next
- biannual budget would be needed to meet the needs of the UW System, as well as the amount
- 23 need to offset any tuition cuts;
- Whereas: An increase in funding to the UW System is necessary in order to meet the needs of
- 25 the ever-developing Wisconsin workforce, raise awareness of high-demand fields, and to keep
- Wisconsin students in Wisconsin;
- 27 Therefore be it resolved: The Student Government Association of the University of Wisconsin-
- 28 Stevens Point asks the Wisconsin Joint Committee on Finance, the Wisconsin Assembly, the
- Wisconsin State Senate to approve an increase in funding for the UW System in the 2025-2027
- 30 biannual budget;
- 31 Therefore be it further resolved: The Student Government Association of the University of
- 32 Wisconsin-Stevens Point asks the Wisconsin Joint Committee on Finance, the Wisconsin
- 33 Assembly, the Wisconsin State Senate to approve a tuition freeze along with increase funding to
- the UW System in order to offset the increase between tuition revenue and system costs.
- 35 Therefore be it finally resolved: That upon passage, this resolution be forwarded to the
- 36 Wisconsin Governor Evers, Wisconsin Assembly Speaker Vos, Wisconsin Assembly Speaker
