- 5 Studio Theatre, Dance Studios, Computer Music Center and Rehearsal Rooms;

- Whereas, Very reflective of other academic buildings such as the Chemistry Bio Building (CBB) and
- 8 The College of Professional Studies (CPS) building, CoFAC students tend to spend large portions of their
- 9 day inside of the NFAC and often do not have time to eat a meal;
- 10 Whereas, Whether it be early in the morning to start their day or around lunch time, students could
- benefit greatly from a café housed inside of the NFAC;

- have a café inside of the NFAC as they have claimed that it would not only be utilized but have deemed it
