1 Statute In Support Of Creating A Voting Compliant Student ID

- Whereas: In 2020, UW Stevens Point had a voting rate of 59.5%, 6.5% less than the national
- 3 voting average*;
- 4 Whereas: UW Superior and UW La Crosse have student ID meeting Wisconsin's laws to make
- 5 them voting compliant;
- 6 Whereas: In 2020 UW Superior and UW La Crosse voting rates of 65% and 67.9% respectively,
- 7 averaging in excess of the national voting average of 66%**;
- 8 Whereas: UW Superior and UW La-Crosse's voting rates exceeded UW Stevens Point's
- 9 (UWSP) by an average of 7%, which is likely due, at least in part, to their voting compliant
- 10 student ID;
- 11 Whereas: A normal UWSP student ID costs \$6.15 to make;
- Whereas: Adding a date of issuance, an expiration date within two years of issuance, and a
- 13 student signature would make UWSP student IDs voting compliant and would raise the cost to
- 14 \$6.81, a cost difference of only \$0.66***;
- 15 Whereas: This action would allow out of state students to be able to vote without excessively
- 16 prohibitive barriers;

- Whereas: This action would allow students who do not have a valid ID to vote without 17 18 excessively prohibitive barriers; Whereas: Issuing voting compliant student IDs allows students who may not have access to 19 certain documents, the time, or the resources to get to and go through lengthy DMV process 20 Whereas: Issuing voting compliant student IDs can be expected to increase the student voting 21 22 rate at UWSP: Whereas: According to CIRCLE, the college vote in Wisconsin often has a significant effect on 23 elections, at many times being the deciding factor****; 24 Whereas: Issuing voting compliance student IDs at UWSP will allow UWSP students to have a 25 legitimate impact on their local community, thus creating civically engaged members of society 26 Therefore, be it resolved: The University of Wisconsin – Stevens Point Student Government 27 Association recognizes the importance of civic engagement for a college student and our 28 democratic institutions: 29 Therefore, be it further resolved: The University of Wisconsin – Stevens Point Student 30 Government Association supports the continued issuance of student IDs that meet Wisconsin 31 state law for voting compliant IDs, in order to allow all students to exercise their right to vote 32 33 and participate in democracy, for all further classes of the University Of Wisconsin Stevens Point, so long as the institution remains standing; 34 Therefore, be it finally resolved: That upon passage of this statute, it shall be sent to Chancellor 35 Gibson, Vice Chancellor Al Thompson, Chancellor Gibson's Chief of Staff, Rob Manzke, The 36 Point Card Office, and all others needed for appropriate implementation. 37 ****Booth, Ruby B, et al.
